All attendees must not only have a ticket but also one or two items for evaluation. Everyone will be seen by an appraiser and a lucky few will be pulled aside to be on the show when it airs.

On your postcard, list your name, address, city, state and zip. You also can request a morning or afternoon entry time. Some 3000 entries will be selected and winners will each receive 2 tickets. 
